## Housekeeping Notes: Monthly Rental Payments

Payments are due by the 1st of every month. The statement that is sent is a courtesy statement, and you do not need to wait for it to arrive to make your payment. Payments can be made directly to the Administration Office at each Airport, or you may charge it every month automatically to your credit card. Payments are considered late when they are received after the 15th of the month. Payments sent in the envelope that comes with your statement go directly to our bank for processing and may take up to 3-5 days to process, so when mailing them, please allow ample time for processing or you may be assessed a late fee.

## A Message From the LA County Department of Public Works-Aviation Division...

### Airport Minimum Standards & Permits

Minimum Standards and Permits were recently adopted by the County of Los Angeles Board of Supervisors and will be implemented across the County-owned airports in the coming weeks. Airport management will be making arrangements to meet individually with each commercial aeronautical operator soon to review the Minimum Standards and Permits and solicit feedback.

Developed through a lengthy process which involved significant stakeholder participation, the Minimum Standards establish minimum requirements (e.g. facility size, qualifications, personnel, equipment, hours of activity and insurance) to be

met by all persons as a condition for the privilege to conduct certain aeronautical activities or provide commercial aeronautical products, services, or facilities at the County-owned airports. Common types of commercial activities occurring at the County-owned airports today include aircraft maintenance, aircraft rental, and flight training. However, the Minimum Standards also cover several less common but relevant activities, such as noncommercial self-fueling (fueling an entity's own aircraft with the entity's own equipment) and commercial fueling (providing aviation fuels on a commercial basis). The Permits, which were also developed along with the Minimum Standards, are intended to ensure that commercial aeronautical operators and

self-fueling activities are properly licensed, certified, and insured, and comply with all relevant regulatory measures, including the Minimum Standards.

The Minimum Standards and Permits are consistent with County airport rules and regulations and FAA guidelines and recommendations. Overall, the documents are intended to protect airport users and authorized commercial aeronautical operators while promoting quality general aviation products, services and facilities at the County-owned airports.
